

Tell your grocer to demand that its suppliers treat workers with dignity and respect!!



Consumers and the grocery industry should know the following about the Giumarra Companies, who market and distribute globally-sourced *Nature's Partner* produce:

July 28th, 2004 Asuncion Valdivia falls to his death after picking grapes in triple digit heat at Giumarra. His foreman cancelled the ambulance called to save his life.

July 21st, 2005 Agustín Gudiño also dies from toiling under the intense summer heat at Giumarra.

September, 2005 Giumarra illegally interferes with workers' efforts to win a union election by harassing and intimidating them. Workers are left with the status quo—low wages, unsafe working conditions, and rampant abuse.

July, 2007 Sal Giumarra yells at worker Francisco Martinez for using a nearby umbrella for shade when none was provided: "That umbrella is not for you! It is for the grapes!"

August, 2009 Workers are made to race in 100+ degrees weather—the worker to pick the least would face unpaid suspension in already tough economic times.

January, 2010 The Federal Government (EEOC) files suit against Giumarra for the repeated sexual harassment of a teenage female farm worker and the subsequent firing of her and her coworkers after they spoke out against the mistreatment.
